

Selected articles from the Lion Magazine January.

January 1931-Celina, took an active part in the Armistice Day parade and presented a Lions Cup to the American Legion Post of Celina in honor of their winning first prize in musical "40 et 8" competition at the national convention.

January 1931-Lima, members to assist the Penny Fund of their city which has an object of 1,000 pounds of pennies, donated to the fund. Each Lion gave a penny for each year of his life. The donation totaled \$22.92 and weighed more than 15 pounds.

January 1932- Arcanum, bought and planted twenty shade trees along the park drive to honor George Washington's bi-centennial, and also secured thirty more trees to for the citizens to plant.

January 1932-Defiance, sponsored a charity dance which netted \$250 for work among needy families for winter.

January 1949-Lima, held its Annual Stag Party, and made a profit of \$600 for work with the blind.

January 1949-West Mansfield, operated a refreshment stand in connection with the softball field and made a profit for the season of over \$300.

January 1953-Waynesfield, conducted a lunch stand at the county fair in conjunction with the P.T.A. The net return for the activity fund was \$899.

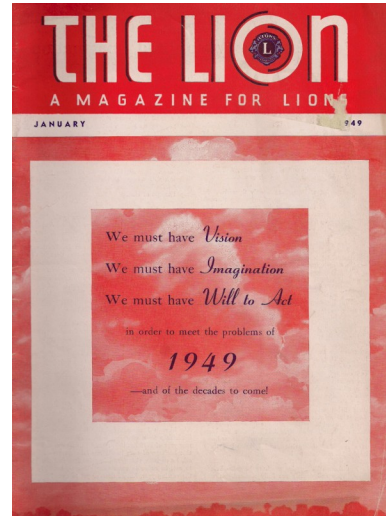

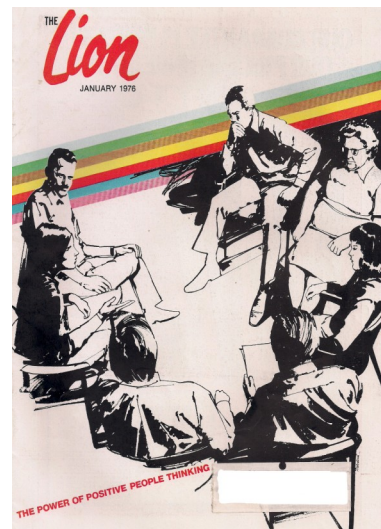
