The District Convention is almost here. I'm very excited about the opportunity to see many Lions friends, give out awards for all the service that has taken place this year, and learn more about Lionism from our International Guest, ID Jeff Gan. We also have a fun slot from 2:30-4:00 PM on Saturday afternoon as we enjoy our version of a "county fair." The deadline for registering is April 1 so this seems a little late, but if you want to attend our business meetings and the county fair, you can bring \$10 and join the fun.

Three important business items were enacted at the February Cabinet Meeting. One, we approved a form for providing support to families who include a child or children with cancer. Look for the form later in the newsletter and in the Website under Resources. Two, we closed the Community Impact Grant to the Ebeid Cancer Institute at Toledo Pro-Medica Hospital. Since the television monitors came in under estimates, we voted that the balance of the grant will be spent on iPads which patients can use for treatment protocols and other information. Finally, we approved the following motion, "District OH1 will implement a Club Growth Program for 1 year, from Convention (4-15-2023) to Convention (4-5-2024), that any OH1 Club that adds a new member and pays that member's initiation fee and half dues from its administrative funds is entitled to apply to the OH1 District for an incentive grant to pay the initiation fees and half dues for the next two new members to join the club, up to adding 6 new members."

This can be done in the following manner: if the new member comes in before July 1, he or she will pay the pro-rated dues according to the LCI dues billing table, and his/her dues July 1-December 31 will be paid by the club or district. If the new member comes in after June 30, he/she will pay one-half the pro-rated dues according to the LCI dues billing table, and will have no further financial obligation until July 1 of the 2024. Council Chair Kevin Reidy challenges all clubs to add two new members between May 1 and June 30. Clubs accomplishing this will receive a banner patch.

I enjoyed visiting West Liberty for a combined Zones 8-9 Meeting, Coldwater, Venedocia for a pancake and sausage breakfast, Columbus Grove, and the Region One Meeting at Napoleon. In addition, I attended District Conventions in Lancaster, Columbus and Mansfield. I can assure you MD13 clubs are serving their communities in OH1, as well as across our State. I hope to see you all at our convention April 14-15.

Lions Leaders,

You have no doubt been receiving emails from Lions Clubs International regarding the new Lions Portal. Ohio's Global Service Team just wants to make sure that you are informed about upcoming changes.

Set for release in July 2023, LCI is revamping their online service and membership reporting sites, combining **MyLion, MyLCI, Insights** and other tools into one cohesive site called the **LIONS PORTAL**.

THINGS TO KNOW:

1. All service reports for the 2022-2023 year must be entered by JUNE 15, 2023. Any projects or fundraisers on or after JUNE 15, will be entered in the new **LIONS PORTAL**.
2. Make sure your club officers and members' email addresses, birthdates, and contact information is correct by JUNE 15, 2023. They will not be able to log in without their own working email address: your email address will be your username.
 - **UPDATING INFORMATION** - as of this morning, the club secretary and club administrator can change/update any member information *except* name, member number, and join date.
 - Please print out your roster (under My Lions Club/Reports) and have members note any changes at your next meeting!
