Hello fellow Lions of OH1, I hope everyone is doing well and doing their best trying to transgress through this crisis. I want to take this time to update everyone on issues at the international level, state or Multiple District level and at our district level.

Internationally speaking our international president this year is Dr. Chung-Yui Choi from South Korea and he will be our president next year as well. First Vice President is Doug Alexander from Brooklyn, New York, 2nd vice is Brian Sheehan from Bird Island, Minnesota and 3rd vice is Dr. Patty Hill of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. Lions International Board of Directors, all 34 of them, will be back next year to serve at least another year and included in that group is our very own Steve Thornton of The Wooster Noon Lions who I am happy to say is recovered from the Covid 19 virus. The USA Canada Forum is scheduled to take place this year starting on Thursday September 17 and wrapping up on Saturday September 19. If you have registered and paid and the event is cancelled you have the option of receiving a refund or forwarding your fee and using it to register for the forum in 2021 which is in Des Moines, Iowa on September 9-11. The International Convention next year is scheduled for June 25-29 in Montreal, Canada. So we have three international events in the next 16 months fairly close to home. Start making plans and trust me, once you attend an international convention or USA Canada forum you will want to go back.

This past Saturday, our multiple district more commonly known as our state of Ohio Lions had a zoom Council of Governors meeting more commonly known as a COG meeting.
